




Badge Bottle Whiskey Bottle from Towson circa 1900





HISTORICAL EVENTS IN SEPTEMBER BY DAY (http://holidayinsights.com/history)

- 1: The Liberty Bell arrives in Philadelphia. (1752) | "Mary Had a Little Lamb" was published. (1830) | Emma M. Nutt becomes the first woman telephone operator. (1878) | Germany invades Poland, starting World War II. (1939) | The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame opens in Cleveland, OH. (1995)
- 2: Richard the Lion-Hearted is crowned King of England at Westminster. (1189) | The Great Fire of London started. 80% of the city is destroyed. (1966) | Bing Crosby makes his solo radio debut.
